# CT4EU Report #3

April - June 2025

Dear Supporters of the Campaign, Dear Friends of Combined Transport,

The second quarter of 2025 was dedicated to strengthening our collaboration with the CT4EU National Coordinators, which has helped us to gain a better understanding of the issues facing the sector locally. This will enable us to identify synergies between UIRR's lobbying activities at the EU and the national levels. In addition, we are pleased to announce the launch of our newly redesigned website, developed to better reflect the spirit and values of the campaign—positive, dynamic, and forward-looking.

Another marking moment of this quarter was the CT4EU Intermodal Conference co-organised by <u>UIRR</u> and <u>Fermerci</u> at the Transport Logistic Fair in Munich on 4 June. The first part of the conference saw some supporters and National Coordinators take to the stage to share their views on the results of the campaign. They highlighted the tangible effects of the campaign on Combined Transport's (CT) reputation, and described it as one of the best tools to promote rail's benefits in CT.

The second part of the event was hosted by Fermerci, where MEP Flavio Tosi, the Rapporteur of the Combined Transport Directive, revealed that he has commissioned a study to analyse the location of terminals, due for completion by September. This will allow him to develop a clear and practical



































definition of "combined transport operation", which will simplify the allocation of state aid to our sector.

Our campaign is about more than just convincing the freight transport businesses to choose Combined Transport, it is also a tool for appealing to decision-makers to support our sector. The fact that MEP Tosi chose to share his plans at our event epitomises our efforts.

Our promotional work continues by showcasing the efficiencies, the innovations and solutions that Combined Transport brings.

### **Updates from Our Supporters**

• <u>Ermewa</u> has reached a new achievement with 50.000 freight wagons in their fleet. "The key is close and trusting cooperation with our customers and manufacturers. Our latest investment in carcarrying wagons is a further step in expanding our offering," said Peter Reinshagen, Managing Director.

- Agieren's team is expanding with Giulia Bornati and Razvan Sebastian Stirban. With its growing team, Agieren will be able to provide intermodal-related consultancy services to Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, and now also Greece, Turkey, China, Romania, and Bulgaria.
- <u>Ports of Genoa</u> welcomed an institutional delegation from the Parliament of the Land of North Rhine-Westphalia the last week of June. They illustrated the activities and initiatives launched in the ports of Genova and Savona, with particular attention to infrastructure projects, environmental sustainability strategies and interventions aimed at strengthening the integration between port and city.
- Rail-Flow's Christoph Tomec joined the European Space Agency's NAVISP event the last week of June, to present their RaiSu pilot project, which leverages Global Navigation Satellite Systems and TIS data to enhance ETA predictions and boost precision in rail freight logistics. On 16 May, they also celebrated their 5 years anniversary in the most joyful way.
- Adria Kombi Participated in the Slovenian Pavilion during Transport & Logistic in Munich (2–5
  June 2025), showcasing its road-rail intermodal services (e.g., container shuttles Koper
  hinterland, rolling motorway Maribor–Wels, door-to-door KOMAR logistics).
- <u>Trafikverket</u> On 14 April, the Swedish transport administration and the Port of Trelleborg reached an agreement to significantly boost intermodal capacity by developing a modern intermodal terminal and freight yard. The goal is to increase handling capacity from currently 40.000 units to 150.000 by 2033.
- <u>LTE Logistics & Transport</u> was at NavigátorVilág rail transport conference on 10 April to discuss the challenges and opportunities of intermodal transport. They were also at FH <u>St. Pölten University of Applied Sciences</u> to attract younger generation into our dynamic sector.
- <u>Stena Line</u> was present at the UIRR General Assembly (26 May) and at its Operations Interest Group (30 June) to present the added value of their Rail Ferry line.
- <u>Codognotto</u> is expanding its short sea shipping services to Turkey. They organise between 3 and 7 departures per week from Trieste, Bari or Venice to Istanbul, Yalova, Izmir or Mersin.
- <u>Sicom</u> celebrated their 50 years on 13 June, and the same time showing solid financial results for the year 2024.


The second half of this year, CT4EU will produce 3 webinars. <u>Dates and registration will be announced soon, so stay tuned!</u>
